## RENISEN

## **Objetive:**

The Stroke Registry of the Spanish Neurology Society (RENISEN) was designed and edited by the Cerebrovascular Diseases Study Group of the Spanish Neurological Society, with the goal of establishing a national stroke data bank with the potential for the development of cooperative studies using large samples of stroke patients, permitting conclusions to be drawn about the epidemiological and stroke care situation in our country.

It is available to any member of the Cerebrovascular Diseases Group, for local and individual use if preferred, as a tool to generate one's own stroke database since one of the main objectives of RENISEN is to give all neurology units the possibility of generating their own stroke banks, using a common language and internationally approved criteria, thus facilitating collaboration between centres.

At <u>www.renisen.org</u> you can consult the regulations applicable to users, rights and duties, and access the registry to include and download patient data after receiving your exclusive password.

Each user can exclusively access the data of their own centre, but can request the complete national registry after receiving approval for their project from the Evaluation Committee.

The RENISEN data bank began in January 2011 and constitutes the evolution of the original BADISEN registry, which started in 1994.-In the spirit of being useful both for individuals and collaborative projects, it too will in time give way to new adaptations.

Over time, and particularly in recent years, RENISEN has allowed the development of studies published in journals with high impact factors thanks to the large number of patients in the registry, which currently stands at 30,000.
